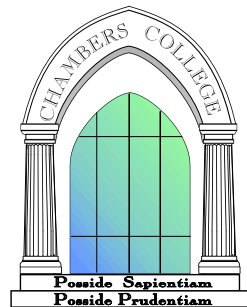

Introduction

Our program allows students to be working on Chambers College credits and high school credits at the same time. The CHESS Honors Diploma high school program is especially suited for this program.

Jump Start can provide tremendous savings in both time and money for a student who is capable of doing college work.

Guidelines for participation in the program

1. Apply for admission into the Jump Start Program by filling out a Chambers College Jump Start application.
2. You must be at least age 16 and demonstrate emotional and spiritual maturity as well as academic aptitude to participate. The course load is comparable to the top “Ivy League” and Christian colleges in the U.S.

Program Options

Option One: take a few college level courses to fulfill high school requirements at a more challenging level.

1. You may take as few or as many college courses as you need to meet your high school program objectives.
2. Those not enrolled in a degree program at Chambers College will receive a grade report only that may be submitted for high school credit.
3. College level courses may be utilized to complete a high school course, but high school courses cannot be used for college credit.

Option Two: enroll early in a Chambers College degree program and complete high school requirements at the same time.

All your college level course work taken under Chambers College, as well as other college level courses at other institutions, can be applied to fulfill the requirements to receive a Chambers College degree. Chambers College offers two undergraduate degrees.

- i. A.A. of Christian ministry (65 credit hours)
- ii. B.A. of Christian Ministry (130 credit hours)

Jump Start Programs

❖ Continuing education student

The student is taking courses from Chambers College, but the student has not applied or enrolled in a degree program such as an A.A. or B.A. These courses can later be applied to a degree and receive a transcript if the student chooses to fully enroll in a degree program at a later time. You receive a grade report after each course, but not a transcript showing all your class work with Chambers College.

❖ Enrolled in a degree program at Chambers College

You are working towards a degree (B.A. or A.A. in Christian ministry) and developing a transcript as a record. You will need to apply as a full-time college student.

If you desire to earn a private school high school diploma, we have a cooperative arrangement with Colorado Heritage Education School System (CHESS). Financial discounts are available to students who are co-enrolled in CHESS and Chambers College programs.

Fees/Discounts

- a. CHESS Diploma students need only pay one general service fee when taking college courses. You do not pay both the college semester fee and the high school semester fee.
- b. Transferring college level courses taken during the high school years onto a Chambers College transcript is \$4.00 per credit hour fee.

Our fees and tuition are less than most junior colleges and most private high schools.

Transferring Credits

Chambers College has built a reputation based upon our students' performance. Our credits generally transfer to other Christian institutions. In our 18 year history, only one college did not accept our credits after appeal.

Our degree programs are accepted by several colleges and seminaries as preparation for graduate studies.

State Capitol Intern Program

Students serve under a Colorado state legislator at the state capitol one to two days per week.

This program is comparable to any other honors program in a college. The requirements are not only academic but also spiritual. Requirements include certifications in different office skills and ability to achieve high standards.



Study in England



Chambers College has developed a study program in London, England. Some lectures are taught by English instructors. Historical sites and concerts make up the bulk of the tour. Students attend church services at Spurgeon's Metropolitan Tabernacle of London. This is the home of the famous preacher Charles Haddon Spurgeon.
